

Farragut provides a college preparatory environment that promotes academic excellence, leadership skills, and social development within a diverse community of young men and women.


rich in history

Founded in 1933 on the banks of the Toms River in Pine Beach, New Jersey, the school is named after Admiral David Glasgow Farragut, the first U.S. Naval officer to rise to that rank. The St. Petersburg campus opened in 1945 on the shores of Boca Ciega Bay and is the only campus open today. Through an act of Congress, the school is an Honor Naval Academy.

the farragut experience

The combination of invaluable academic and life lessons learned at Farragut create what our students and alumni call "The Farragut Experience." We prepare graduates to be critical thinkers ready to succeed, even in careers that do not currently exist. To that end, Farragut has graduated two of the 12 moon-walking astronauts (Alan Shepard '41 and Charlie Duke '43), along with world leaders in business philanthropy, and the military.

a day in the life of a boarding student

0700

Reveille is the daily morning bugle call to wake up.

0715 – 0800 Morning formation followed by breakfast.

0730 - 0800

Morning tutorial is offered every day for thirty minutes before school starts by all faculty members in their classroom.

0715 – 0730 Laundry drop-off is Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

0745 - 0800

Dorms are locked for the academic day and students report to their first class.

0800 - 1530

The school day includes seven courses (academic and/or elective), one study hall period, and morning formation or parade practice.

1600 - 1700

Boarding students participate in extracurricular activities such as athletics, band, drill, the waterfront, intramurals, and the arts. Students not involved in extracurriculars are required to be out of the dormitories and are encouraged to be active outside, ie: jogging the track, playing basketball, events at the waterfront, etc. Dinner is served in the Mess Hall. A full kitchen staff with professional culinary backgrounds prepare fresh meals each day.

1850

First call for CQ (Call to Quarters) which means all boarders need to report back to the dorms in Farragut Hall and prepare for study hall.

1900 – 2030 Weekday study hall.

2030 – 2100 Uniform preparation for the next school day.

2100 – 2145 Free time.

2145 - 2150

CQ for students to report to their dorm rooms.

2200

Taps is the daily evening bugle call to end the day. Boarders are required to fall out and stand at attention outside their dorm room until everyone is accounted for. Main dorm room lights must be turned off, however boarders may study quietly at their desks with the desk light on.

> Time is displayed in military time. Exact times are subject to change. Daily room inspection occurs while the boarders are attending school.

College Prep Curriculum

Beginning in 9th grade, students are encouraged to choose advanced courses including Honors, Advanced Placement, and AP Capstone. Dual Enrollment is also offered in partnership with St. Petersburg College and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University.

Signature Programs


In addition to our core curriculum and electives, students may take advantage of Naval Science, Engineering, Aviation, Marine Science, Sailing, and Scuba.

The Arts

The arts program caters to all skill sets and levels of experience, and is designed for a wide variety of creative personalities. It includes drawing and painting, band and choir, graphic design, and drama/theater.

Technology & Small Classrooms

Farragut is a Google-based school that uses the 1:1 Chromebook program, advanced teaching technology, and interactive SMART Boards. Small classrooms that average 10-17 students allow our teachers to give the individualized attention needed to nurture each student's genuine interest in the subject matter.







A Space for the Arts

Admiral Farragut Academy's newest campus addition, DeSeta Hall, is a beautiful, multi-purpose performing arts building that reflects Farragut Hall's distinctive appearance and historic charm.

DeSeta Hall includes a large state-of-theart auditorium/theatre that seats 500 with a retractable seating system, classrooms for band, music, art, and drama, staff offices, and a lobby/ reception area. Thanks to our many generous donors, this space will allow Farragut to continue its mission to create well-rounded students and an interest in the arts.



Tutorials and Study Halls

We provide an in-depth support system for any student who needs help in any area -- from managing time to mastering a subject. Additional time with teachers is offered before, during, and after school. Two additional hours are given each night during study hall for boarding students.

ESOL [English for Speakers of Other Languages]

Four levels of ESOL are offered during the academic day.

Center for Academic Success

Additional resources are available for students in the Student Center. Services include educational testing, academic coaching, weekly project planning, reading, and more.

Structured Environment

As an Honor Naval School, the Naval Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (NJROTC) Program is an integral part of the college preparatory mission in high school. It provides character education and the structure for a focused academic atmosphere where students are challenged.

Traditional Values

Our students learn self-discipline, orderliness, accountability, respect for self and others, and grow to be resilient and emotionally mature by the time they graduate.

Skills and Knowledge

Upper School naval science courses consist of naval history, physical fitness, military drill, seminars in leadership, and sailing. All students are required to earn their Qualified Boat Handler's (QBH) License to graduate.





Extracurricular Opportunities

Students have the opportunity to participate in color guard, exhibition drill team, and sailing team. They may also participate in local JROTC field meets, attend summer sessions such as Leadership Academy and Boys' and Girls' State, meet military leaders, and much more.

Set the Example

Peer leadership positions are earned based on seniority, performance, and qualifications. Our naval science students consistently earn the NJROTC Distinguished Unit Award.

Nominations and Scholarships

Each year Farragut can nominate up to six cadets to the Naval Academy, five to the Air Force Academy, and three to West Point Military Academy. Qualified students take advantage of these opportunities and may pursue a military career, while others go on to traditional four year colleges and universities to pursue other passions.

STEM [Science Technology Engineering Mathematics]

The STEM curriculum engages students in activities, projects, and problembased (APPB) learning through classroom experiences. Students create, design, build, discover, collaborate, and solve problems while applying what they learn in math and science.

The engineering courses engage students on multiple levels, exposing them to areas of study they may not typically pursue, and providing them with a foundation and proven path to college and career success.

Students may also participate in after school Drone and Robotics Clubs.




Discover First-Hand

Our direct waterfront location on Boca Ciega Bay, which is fed by the Gulf of Mexico, keeps us highly active and hands-on when it comes to marine life.

Classes use school-owned boats to explore islands and marine life and two-person seine nets or cast nets to collect marine organisms. Students in all grades are sure to find something exciting to bring back to the classroom fish tanks and touch tanks, or for close examination under the microscope.

Upper School scuba classes also go on many day and overnight excursions throughout the year to explore Florida springs, caves, and other off-shore dive sites. Students can earn up to four scuba certifications.







Pilot Training

Since 1998, more than 500 Farragut students have received flight training, over 30 students have earned their Private Pilot's License while at Farragut, and over 100 students have matriculated to the #1 rated aviation college, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. Approximately 15% of our Aviation graduates have gone on to fly in the military or in the commercial sector.

On the Ground

Our state-of-the-art facility includes PCATD (flight simulator with Elite software) and a Weather Station. Courses begin in 9th grade, including a dual enrollment course from Embry-Riddle.

In the Sky

Two hours are allotted during the academic day for flight training at a nearby towered airport.

Beach
