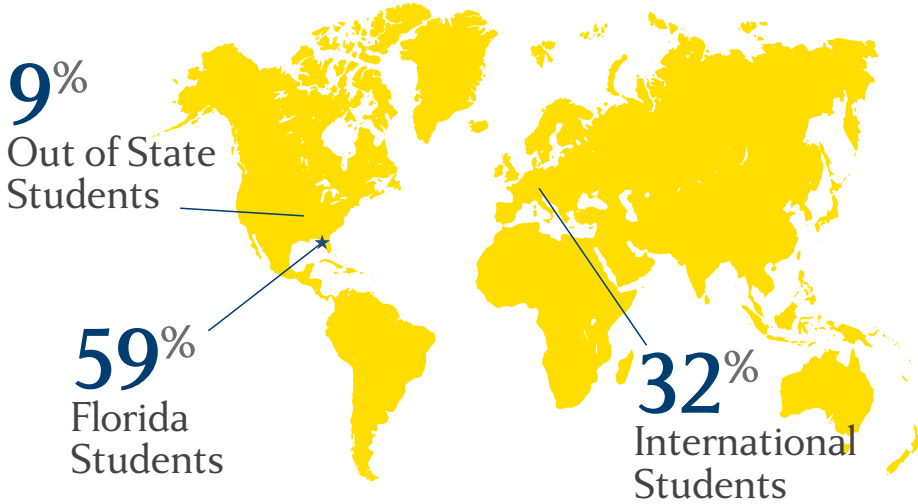

# The Application Process

## ALL SCHOOL APPLICANTS

### APPLICATION FEE

Apply online and pay the non-refundable \$100 application fee by debit or credit card. [www.farragut.org/apply](http://www.farragut.org/apply)

### REQUEST TWO (2) TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS

- › Within the online application, please provide the email addresses of student's current Math and English teachers.
- › An online link will be emailed from Farragut directly to the teacher.

### SUBMIT RECORDS REQUEST FORM TO STUDENT'S CURRENT or MOST RECENT SCHOOL FOR OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

- › Complete the Records Request Form provided by Admissions.
- › Official Transcripts are required from the most recent and/or previous 3 years of schooling.
- › Official Transcripts must be sent by postal mail or express shipping directly from the student's school to our Admissions Office.
- › Official Transcripts must arrive in a signed, sealed envelope.

### TESTING AND EVALUATIONS

- › Testing: Copy of the most recent test scores, ie PSAT, MAP, SSAT, etc.
- › Evaluations (if applicable): copy of Psychological, Educational, or Behavioral Doctor evaluation(s) or Testing, copy of IEP, or 501 plan.

### COMPLETE STUDENT INTERVIEW or CAMPUS TOUR BY APPOINTMENT

- › The interview may be in-person, via Zoom, GoogleMeets, or Microsoft Teams
- › The interview and campus tour can be scheduled at the same time.

### ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE REVIEWS APPLICANT

- › All the items listed above must be submitted to complete the student's application.
- › Once the application is complete, each applicant's file is reviewed by the Admissions Committee.
- › Families are notified of the Admissions Committee's decision by email.
- › The priority deadline for enrollment to the following academic school year is June 1st.



## INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS ONLY

### TRANSCRIPTS

- › International student transcripts must be translated into English by a certified translator of the student's country.
- › Admissions needs both translated and untranslated versions of the student's transcripts.
- › Must submit transcript from 8th grade through most current completed grade level.
- › Transcripts should include curriculum information from student's previous school and how it compares to the American system.

### ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

- › Farragut offers ESL classes (ESOL) for non-English speakers.
- › International applicants from non-English speaking countries are required to demonstrate competency in English in one of the following ways:
- › Submit English Language Proficiency Score, through DuoLingo, IELTS, TOEFL, or TOEFL, Jr.
- › New 11th grade students must qualify for our Advanced ESOL class. The scores recommended are: TOEFL 70, TOEFL Jr. 750, IELTS – overall band score of 5. ESOL class placement will be at the discretion of the Head of Upper School and the ESOL Instructor.

### PROOF OF FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND CITIZENSHIP

- › Family must provide documentary evidence that sufficient funds are or will be available to defray all expenses during the entire period of anticipated study by bank statement or letter.
- › Family must provide a copy of the student's passport.

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
